Faster Payments Use Cases

- shared expenses



Person-to-Person

Payments made by individuals to friends, family members or other individuals

Consumer-to-Government

Payments made by an individual to a government entity

C₂G

Paying taxes or fees (i.e., Federal, State, or Municipality taxes, park passes or licenses)

Payments to an individual B₂C for rebates, refunds, wages or insurance disbursements

Business-to-Consumer

Payments made by a business to a person

Payments to B₂G government including Federal or State tax payments

Payments to businesses for goods and services (i.e., groceries, haircuts, paying a bill, etc.)

C₂B

Consumer-to-Business

Payments made by an individual to a business

Government-to-Consume

Payments made by the government to an individual

G₂C

Payment to consumers. such as tax refunds, social security benefits or

Payments to suppliers services



Business-to-Busines

Payments made from one business to another

Business-to-Governmen

Payments made from a business to a government entity

Account-to-Account

The transfer of funds from one person's account to another account owned by the same person
